Christ is born! When we say something very routinely, it often runs the risk of becoming void of meaning. When greeting someone, the usual question of, “how are you?” rolls immediately off our tongues. Do we really care about how the person is or is this simply a casual, somewhat insincere, greeting? A person can be absolutely miserable and claim that they are fine. The exclamation of “Merry Christmas” runs this same risk. There is meaning behind those words, but we may not be in sync with their depth. God becoming one like us is a cause for great merriment and joy! Do we find ourselves in that place today? We will gather at the homes of family and friends, share a meal, open gifts and spend the day in celebration. We will greet them with the common greeting of “Merry Christmas.” Those words can flow from our tongues “just because” that’s what we’re supposed to say, or they can flow from our tongues because of the profound, life-changing specialness of what we celebrate today. Christmas can easily get preoccupied with the sights and sounds as if they were ends in and of themselves: the decorations, lights, presents, gatherings, food, music, and traditions. But, rather than being ends, all of these things are really pointers to a greater truth that has dawned upon us. Christ our Savior has come to us and changed our lives. This is truly the time to be merry! *Merry Christmas!*

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!



The World Day of Peace - instituted by St. Paul VI in 1968 - is celebrated each year on Jan. 1. The pope provides a message for the occasion, which is sent to foreign ministers around the world.

The pope's message for the 2021 World Day of Peace is entitled, "A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace." The pope published the message on his 84th birthday. In his message, Pope Francis quoted a speech by Pope Paul VI given in 1969 to the Ugandan Parliament: "Have no fear of the Church; she honors you, she educates honest and loyal citizens for you, she does not foment rivalries and divisions, she seeks to promote healthy liberty, social justice, and peace. If she has any preference at all, it is for the poor, for the education of little ones and of the people, for the care of the suffering and abandoned."

Pope Francis also pointed out the "educating people to care begins in the family, the natural and fundamental nucleus of society, in which we learn how to live and relate to others in a spirit of mutual respect. . . The culture of care . . . calls for a common, supportive and inclusive commitment to protecting and promoting the dignity and good of all, a willingness to show care and compassion, to work for reconciliation and healing, and to advance mutual respect and acceptance. As such, it represents a privileged path to peace."






