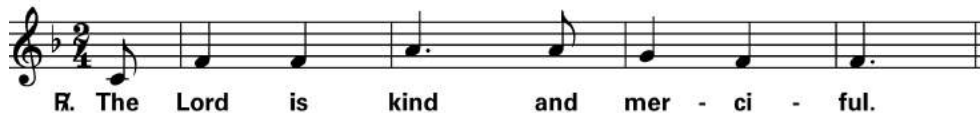

The Apostles' Creed

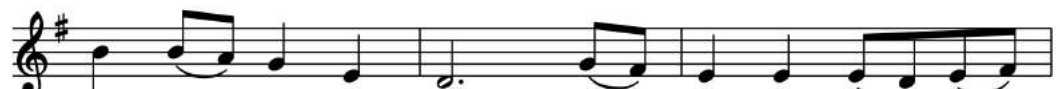
