

Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things? God certainly does not deny us the

pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life, but where do we draw the line? A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime “in the future” while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow, and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. When we are called from this world, will we even know where to begin to look for the tranquility and repose our souls so desperately need?

We cannot be hoarders, pursuers of vanity, or greedy. They don't work, as they are too dependent on things that can fall apart. Rather than constantly feeling the need for more, we must learn to be grateful for what we have. By looking inward, we can learn how to live lives of faithful service to others. “Happiness can only be achieved by looking inward and learning to enjoy whatever life has, and this requires transforming greed into gratitude (St. John Chrysostom).”



St. Alphonsus Liguori | Aug. 1

Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for eight years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in the Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called “mission among the people.” He and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people there.

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, able to connect with ordinary people. His compassion marked his teaching and sermons. Saint Alphonsus taught about God's redeeming love in a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was indeed fear. He was also devoted to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teachings. He wrote more than 100 books that have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available and translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762, Pope Clement XIII made Saint Alphonsus a bishop; however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of ill health. In 1775, he was paralyzed temporarily from rheumatic fever. His rheumatism was so severe it became deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the Church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII.

“He has told us that He is the hungry one. He is the naked one. He is the thirsty one. He is the one without a home. He is the one who is suffering. These are our treasures, she said, looking at the rows of pallets in the caravanserai. They are Jesus.” — *Saint Teresa of Calcutta*



First Reading:

This Day in History — August 3, 1977



The TRS-80 Micro Computer System is a desktop microcomputer launched in 1977 and sold by Tandy Corporation through their Radio Shack stores. The name is an abbreviation of Tandy Radio Shack, Z80 [microprocessor]. It is one of the earliest mass-produced and mass-marketed retail home computers.

Tandy was one of three companies (along with Commodore International and Apple) that started the personal computer revolution by introducing complete pre-assembled microcomputers instead of a kit. Their TRS-80 line of home computers were popular in the years before the IBM PC became commonplace, and had wide distribution in Radio Shack stores at a time when there were few computer stores.
