

Come Out!

Even though we say that we believe in eternal life, there is a part of us that doesn't. There are many times in our lives when we experience death, whether it be the physical death of someone we love, a failed relationship, the loss of a job, or a broken dream. As we go through these death experiences, we can easily find ourselves reaching out to God to improve it and fix it! We think that the proper order of life is to maintain the things of this world, especially those essential to my sense of well-being and security. We do not like change. Grieving from our death experiences can keep us stuck and in despair. If we have lost something or someone of great value, some of life's meaning and essence are lost with them. We need gentle companions to lift us from despair; that is precisely who God desires to be in our life.

God calls us out of our tombs where we have been closed up in fear and despair. He shouts, "Come out!" He desperately wants to show us the path to hope and the new life that is possible

after loss and death. But, our faith can be weak, and we still prefer to cling to the memory of what we had rather than the joyful possibilities of tomorrow. We sometimes live as if God is not real and that the transformative power of his resurrected presence is only a story found in the Bible rather than a narrative unfolding in our lives.

God is the God of surprises, not our demise. God opens new possibilities, begins new chapters, creates new verses, and brings us to new heights! We spend so much time and energy ruminating over what we left behind yesterday that we are far too tired to see what can unfold tomorrow. Loving someone new doesn't negate our past loves. Embracing the love of a person, God, or life itself tomorrow doesn't diminish the love of yesterday. Each of our loves is different, and one cannot be replaced by another. They don't cancel each other out. God truly has tended to every detail of our lives, and if we listen to those details, we find that they all lead us back to him. Jesus wants us to come out of our closed-up tombs. Will we listen or remain in the musty darkness pretending we didn't hear?
