All: We will feed the hungry of body and spirit, break the bread of compassion, distribute the fragments of hope and be fed by the Word within us.


Reader 1: The vineyard is ready. Whom shall I send?






#### The Transfer of the Most Blessed Sacrament


\*\*Verses 5-6 are sung while the priest, kneeling, incenses the Blessed Sacrament.
