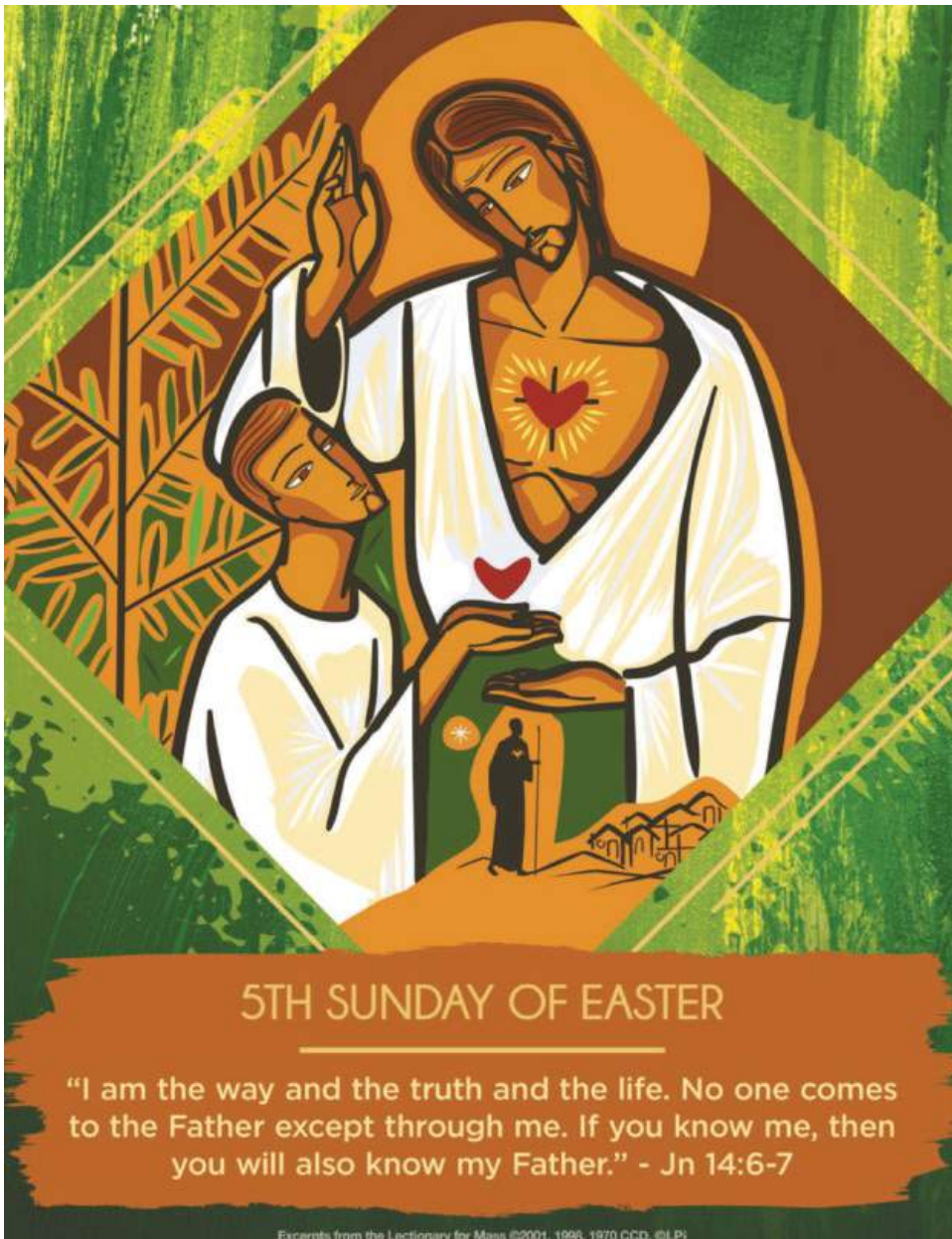

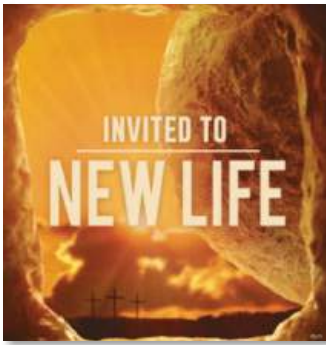

When earthly lives end, especially when the person is young, we tend to focus on and consider "what was lost." We think of lost opportunities, things they wouldn't be able to

see, babies that could not be cradled, and adventures that will go undiscovered. Our minds create this chasm between earth and heaven that sees the losses of this life as permanent ones, never possible to reclaim. This perception causes many folks to remain stuck in their grief as they ponder the "missed opportunities" and regrets.

This is not resurrection thinking. All of the love that we can give and receive, the joy and delight that can be experienced, the adventures that can be undertaken, and the discoveries and possibilities to be realized are all part of a continuous journey. They are not ends in and of themselves but all part of the unfolding of a relationship we have with God, who not only

makes all of these wonderful things possible now but sustains them and fulfills them into eternity! The perception and experience of loss is an illusion because in God's eternal kingdom and in God's time, nothing is ever lost. Even the most intimate and tender moments we can conceive of sharing with another human being are only part of a journey toward perfect intimate, tender moments to be shared with God in our resurrected life! We become "like God" and see God as he is in eternity. What greater joy, love, and hope can ever be discovered as we walk down our often dimly lit paths in this world?

This is an awesome wonder and magnificent news to behold. Call to mind someone you have lost in death. How do you see them now? How do you see yourself in heaven? Remind yourself that God is the way, the truth, and the life. Our happiness will not be fully realized in this world, and there is nothing we can find here that cannot be found one hundredfold in eternity. It's all about relationships and not solely about our relationships with each other, ourselves, and the world in which we live. It's about our relationship with God. If we realize how special that one relationship is, then there is only one particular of heaven and life eternal that matters; that we fall into Love eternal and discover Truth. When we finally close our eyes in death, as long as we are with God, all will be well. There are no losses, only gains.

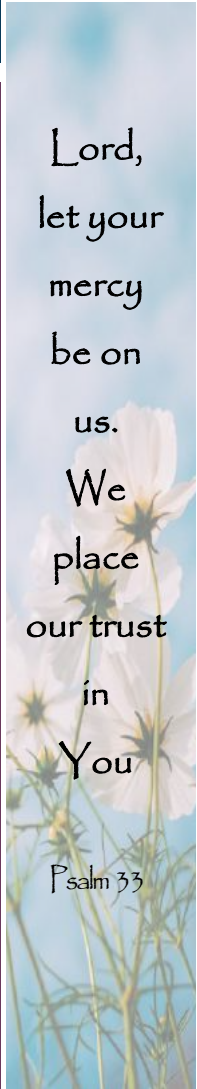
May 29 at 11 a.m.: Memorial Day Mass at St. Augustine Cemetery

This Day in History — Invention of Duct Tape

Vesta Stoudt (April 13, 1891 - May 9, 1966)

Vesta Stoudt was the woman who had the seminal idea for duct tape. While working at an ordnance plant during World War II, she noticed that the way ammunition boxes were sealed made them difficult to open quickly. So, she developed a waterproof, tearable cloth tape to solve the problem. Her bosses at the plant were unimpressed, so she wrote a letter to U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt: Roosevelt liked the idea and sent it to the War Production Board who implemented her tape.

The tape was made with a woven fabric, known as “duck cloth”, coated in waterproof plastic with a layer of rubber-based adhesive and could be torn by hand without the need for scissors. The tape worked great on ammo boxes and soon GIs found it was also useful for fixing leaks, repairing equipment, and even closing up wounds on the battlefield. Stoudt received *Chicago Tribune's* War Worker Award for her idea.



So Oliver, I bet Sean, our Facilities Manager has a picture of Vesta in his office. After all, she is the hero of duct tape, the most important “tool” in a handyman’s box! I think Father Mark has mentioned how good it is at keeping things “shut”. He was looking at me at the time. Wonder why?
