Don't Fear Change

We can be afraid of many things: being rebuked or rejected, anger, being challenged, having to defend ourselves, standing alone, insecurity, failure, and even death. For some, identifying and overcoming their fears

is a daunting task. Regardless of how much they may want to break the cycle of fear, they remain close friends with old and dysfunctional behavioral habits and norms. Maybe what they fear is change. Many gravitate to the familiar and comfortable, and find safety and security, even if they remain mired in mediocrity. Human beings have to learn that there is life beyond "what has always been" and that happiness and depth are possible when old structures and systems have to be left behind.

Can you leave the near and dear, the comfortable and familiar, the safe and the secure, and discover new opportunities? The sheer thought of doing so can bring on feelings of apprehension, intense anger, resentment,

defensiveness, reluctance, resistance, and even apathy. Cowardice can creep in if we must be responsible for making the change. Negative reactions are possible if someone else is to blame for making the change. In the end, only one thing is required, and that is God. If I can rely on and deepen my relationship with God, especially in the Eucharist, then little else is of great concern. United with our community of believers, we find strength. We have to figure out what is important. It is not always what we think.

The Gospel calls us to stretch ourselves and try new things, not to remain stuck and stagnant in familiar ways. We are asked to live life more deliberately, radically, and intentionally. We are asked to leave the familiar behind: learning to live with changing and often limited human structures. We cannot get too caught up in the physical, ideological, or structural systems we are used to. The Holy Spirit always leads and guides us. If we trust this, we will find ourselves doing things we never thought we could do. Always seek the path to joy and love. They keep us from falling victim to our fears and seeking the nostalgic crutches we think we need to achieve a sense of well-being and happiness.

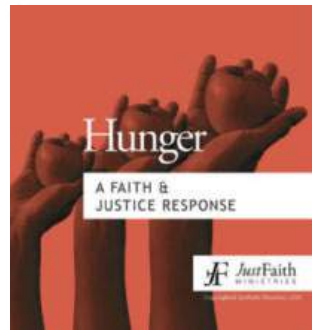

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained

Ordinary Time

Question:

Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time?

Answer:

Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, *tempus ordinarium*, conveys the

sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.
