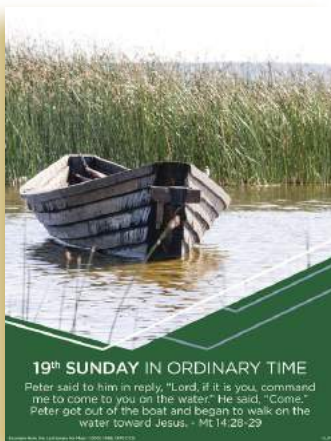

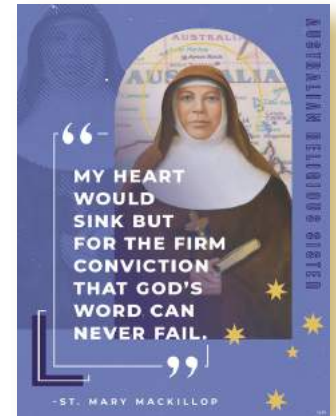

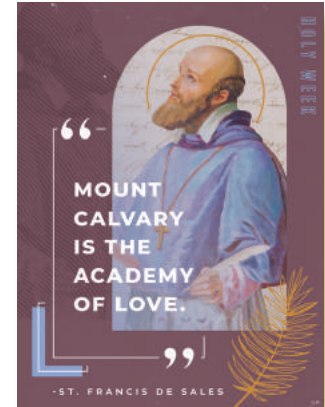
1. My song is love un-known, My Sav-ior's love to

grief like thine. This is my friend, In whose sweet praise


My Lord should take Frail flesh and die?
