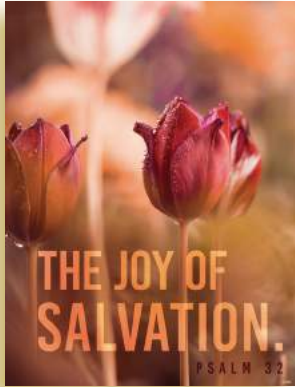

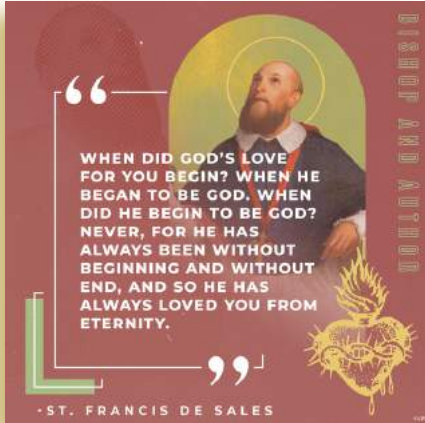

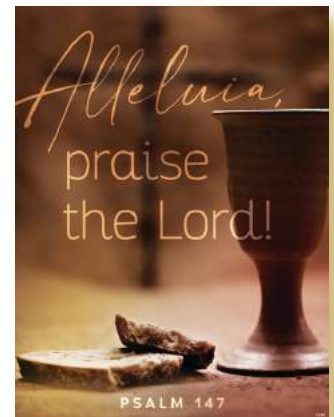
Wounded Alleluias
