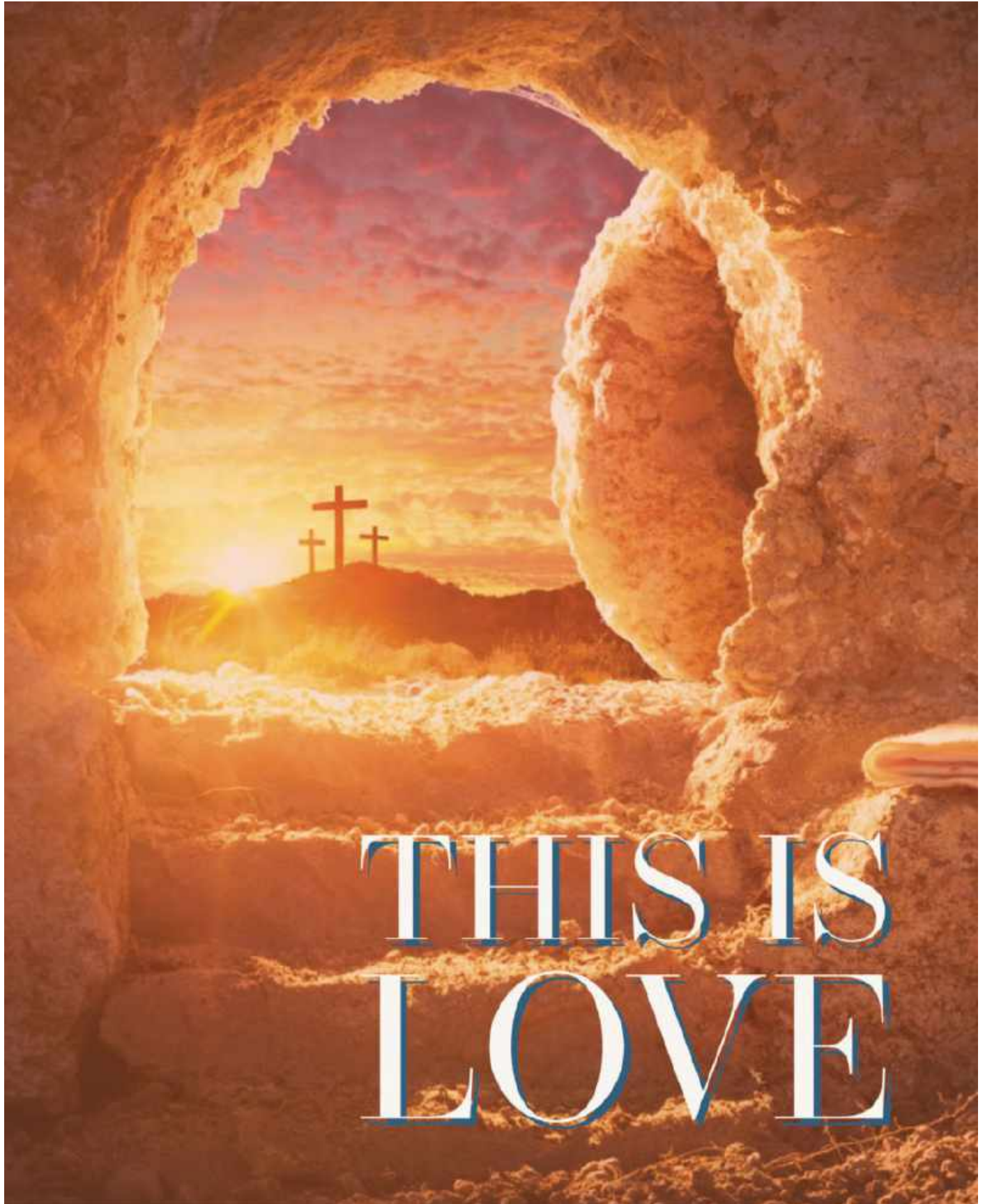

Who are you?

Our identities can be described in so many ways. We can start with our gifts, talents, expertise, and unique personality expressions. We can describe things we like and things we prefer to set aside. As descriptive and captivating as these can be, none come close to our

essence, our authentic selves. While accurate in their own right, the self who lives and interacts with the world is the self we want others to see, the one we project. But there is much more to us, just as there is much more to Jesus.

Jesus could describe himself based on the same criteria we use for ourselves. After all, Jesus is thoroughly human. With all that people witnessed and all that Jesus knew about his physical human self, his divinity also shined forth. There was so much more to learn about him. Whereas once Jesus was transfigured on top of a mountain before his disciple's eyes, today he is transfigured before our eyes as

he reveals his resurrected self as Christ. Alleluia, Christ is risen! His glorified presence shows us that we are much more than we see ourselves to be or show to others. 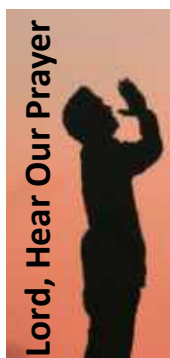

Reflect and Respond to Scripture

First Reading:

In his speech, Peter places much emphasis on his personal witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. *To whom this week could you witness your faith in the resurrection of Jesus?*

Paul taught the believers in Colossae to anticipate the return of the resurrected Jesus. *How does your family celebrate Easter Sunday?*

Gospel:

Mary Magdala, Peter, and the Beloved Disciple were the first to experience the joy and mystery of the empty tomb. *Do you recall when you first started believing in the resurrection of Jesus?*

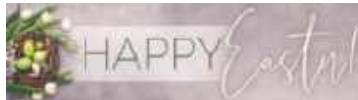
Easter in the Roman Catholic Church is always on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. **Easter eggs**, also called **Paschal eggs**, are sometimes decorated. They are used as gifts on the occasion of Easter. The oldest tradition is to use dyed and painted chicken eggs. Still, a modern custom is to substitute chocolate eggs wrapped in colored foil, hand-carved wooden eggs, or plastic eggs filled with confectionery, such as chocolate.



However, real eggs continue to be used in Central and Eastern European Christian traditions to celebrate Eastertide. Followers of Christianity see the egg as a symbol of resurrection: while being dormant, it contains a new life sealed within it. In addition, one ancient tradition was the staining of Easter eggs with red "in memory of the blood of Christ, shed as at that time of his crucifixion."

Being of Polish and Russian ancestry, Fr. Mark knows all about the beautiful egg-decorating tradition. I bet he will color some eggs for his Easter basket, too!

Bunnies and chicks are secular symbols of Easter, representing the beginning of spring. It's a good thing there are no bunnies at our house, Harry. There are chocolate ones in Dad's basket but we can't eat those either!
