

April 27/28: Live Stream Changes



Spiraling out of control is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness,

and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. "Feelings" have become a "new god," and traditional structures and ideals are being set aside. Rather than learning from what has gone before, with its successes and failures, many need to erase it so that we can finally set things right. The truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checkered past and must be corrected, it is hardly the case that everything done was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives but to learn from mistakes that were made, preserving the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have a tough time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be. Only in God can we find our best selves, discovering who we are and who we can be. Sadly, many think that religion, too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. Today, We are especially reminded that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God's life.

Giving up our will to God's will can be a painful endeavor. It is difficult to set our desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God's commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be "human freedoms." However, they are the only way we can find freedom. And until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be, or how life can be lived. Most certainly, we will not know peace.



Anyone familiar with gardening knows that proper and timely pruning is essential. The health of the plant depends upon it. An unpruned tree can quickly produce suckers that zap many of the vital nutrients from its body. Pruning requires patience and vision. Studies reveal that plants often respond defensively to being pruned, displaying reactions similar to hurt or discomfort. Pruning is not easy but necessary. A hard lesson for us to learn is that we also need to be pruned. We become far healthier when we allow God to stretch, refine, and form us into the best version of our-selves. The fruit from our vines will be more abundant, nutritious, and robust. Left to our own devices, we can easily find ourselves running amuck and spiraling out of control. Without a proper vision and trust in the Master Pruner, we will never find the contentment we desperately desire. Also, the work of the Gospel does not stand a chance of succeeding.

This Day in History — April 28, 2024 — FAQ About Archbishops



Oliver and I welcome Archbishop Christopher Coyne to our parish! We are good shepherds too, always alerting our Dad to new friends in our backyard. Waybe we can help Archbishop Coyne with all of his new friends too!

How is a new archbishop chosen?

Canon 401 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law states that all bishops must submit their resignation to the Pope at 75. The Pope can accept their resignation at that time or ask them to stay on until their successor is chosen. All aspects of selecting a successor are supposed to be confidential, but some things are known. The papal nuncio will present a list of candidates for the investigation to (in the case of the U.S.) the Congregation of the Bishops in the Roman Curia. The congregation then reports to the Pope, who makes the final decision.

Does the new archbishop have to be a bishop already?

Though it rarely happens, a newly named archbishop need not be a bishop first. In this case, however, the new archbishop would need to be ordained as a bishop before he could be installed as an archbishop.

What's the difference between an archbishop and a bishop?

An archbishop is the head of a diocese that is considered particularly important, such as an archdiocese. In sacred matters, an archbishop is the equivalent of a bishop, but "archbishop" is deemed a more prestigious title. As the residential bishop, an archbishop is also known as the local ordinary.

The Most Reverend Henry J. O'Brien was named the ninth bishop of Hartford on Apr. 7, 1945. During the prosperity of this post-war era, the number of Connecticut Catholics was growing, and many parishes were built in the suburbs. On Aug. 6, 1953, Pope Pius XII established the Dioceses of Bridgeport and Norwich, and Hartford became an archdiocese comprising Hartford, New Haven, and Litchfield counties. As a result, on Oct. 21, 1953, Bishop O'Brien was installed as the first Archbishop of Hartford.
