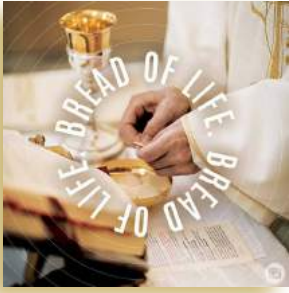
Celebrant: Behold the Lamb (...) Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lord.

For us he sent his Spirit here to guide, to strengthen, and to cheer.

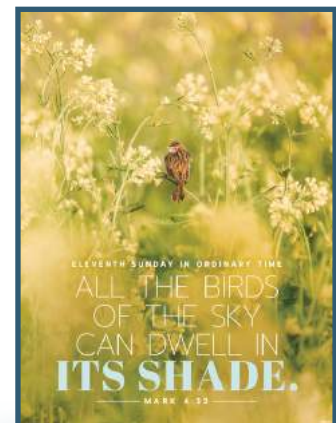
