

Homily

<u>Profession of Faith:</u> TM p. 82 <u>The Apostles' Creed</u>

Mary, Mother of the church, pray for us. Saint Joseph, Patron of our Archdiocese, pray for us. Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.


