

Inspiration for the Week

God calls us to bring his Word to all corners of

the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the world's wisdom as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one-on-one, face-to-face. Rejection is possible when the rubber meets the road, and the message is challenging. That's the litmus test for whether we're doing what we have been asked.




PODCAST: Pondering Our Expectations of God

Have you ever stopped to ponder what you expect out of your faith? Put another way, what do you want from God?

Maybe the work is best left to the professionals.

That's how many people view the preaching of the Gospel. That's what priests, religious,

deacons, lay ministers, and other professional church people do. It has little to do with me. Well, that's not true. The fact is that preaching the Gospel has everything to do with you, with all of us who are baptized members of the Body of Christ. Nobody gets off the hook from that job. The question is: how do we do it? Well, there's a safe way to preach the Gospel and a risky way. The safe way keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. I say my prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, attend Bible Study, and maybe talk about the homily with my friends. That covers the bases, right?

Wrong.

The risky way is the more challenging and, for many, the "road less traveled." Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost, or living self-insulated lives in a society that served the rich and neglected the poor. While many welcomed what they had to say and their conversations, others no doubt rejected them and tossed them out on their ear!

While the Gospel is a message of joy and hope, it is not always well received by those comfortable keeping things as they are. When what we are doing suits us and meets our needs, we see things one way. When what we are doing no longer does, and we are left wanting, the picture changes. God doesn't want to leave anyone behind.

The risky way involves example and conversation. We must take the Gospel from church and carry it wherever we go. What kinds of conversations do we have with others? We interact with those closest to us in our work, social circles, institutions, corporations, politics, and beyond. Our conversations with others reveal a great deal about how we see things, our needs, and what we consider essential. If we want to see God's vision for the world succeed, we will discuss it. It will become a part of our everyday conversation and find its way into our interactions. How can we better preserve the dignity of human life, encourage others to have a relationship with God, live value-centered virtuous lives, deal with injustice, combat racism, build a successful and viable economy, and learn better ways to resolve conflicts without violence are just a few of the things we can engage.

If we are going to succeed in the future, we must find a way to bring our prayer-centered lives into the marketplace. Our conversations must change. Not everyone wants to hear what the Gospel has to say, yet that's a risk God asks us to take.

Gospel:


Jesus taught the apostles to preach and heal only in places where they were welcomed. *Do you recall a time or a place where you felt truly welcomed?*

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER
