Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.

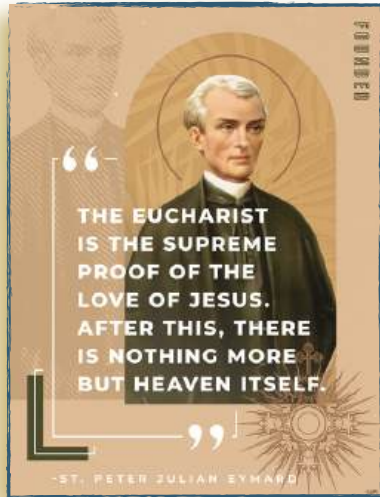


