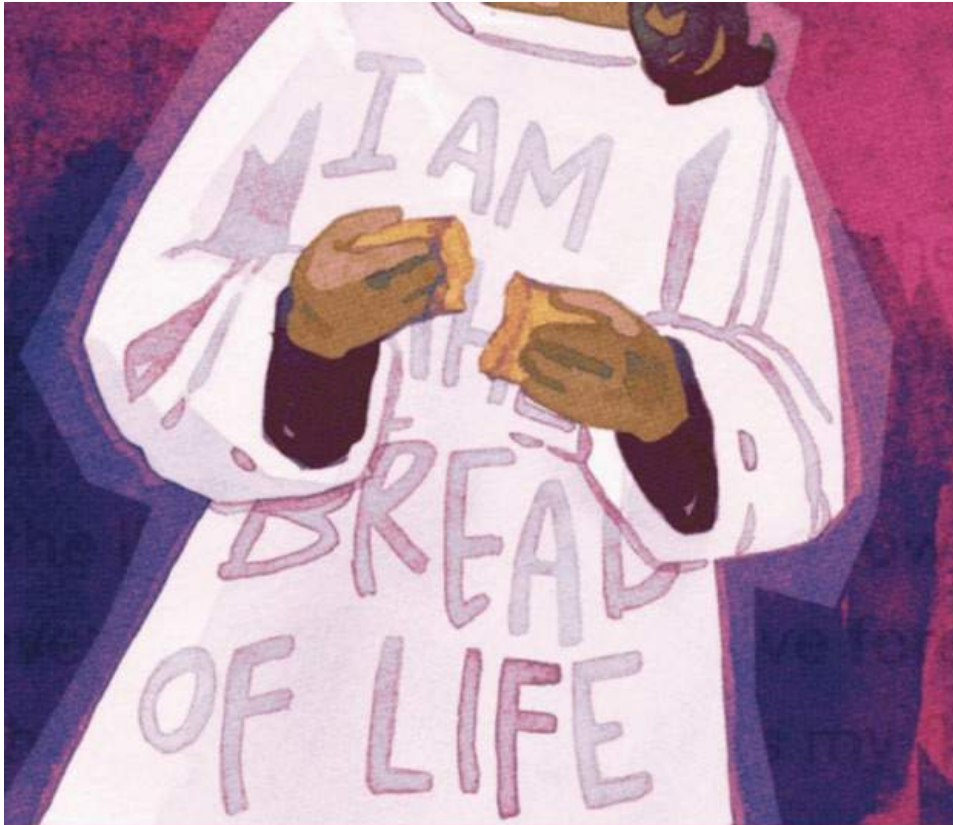

Inspiration for the Week

Are we willing to be taught by God?

If we are, we will begin to see things and judge using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its Divine spark, and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has difficulty seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then learn the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all our relationships: with God, others, ourselves, and creation. As the true and lasting bread from heaven, He shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. This divine lens shows that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.

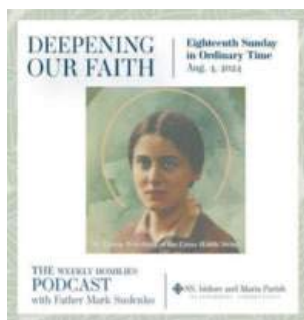

PRAY FOR UKRAINE



The lens through which we view life makes a difference.

It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply

what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things, and things can be dissected and understood only based on what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree, and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and

in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives comes from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens to give human beings desperately needed purpose and meaning. From this perspective, life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God's generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning do our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity? We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. Only by allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus can faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the extraordinary, unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?

Smokey Bear

The first Smokey Bear poster debuted on Aug. 9, 1944, so Aug. 9 is used as Smokey's birthday.

The debut poster used the slogan, "Care will prevent 9 out of 10 forest fires!" In 1950, a bear cub was rescued from a New Mexico wildfire and became the live embodiment of the cartoon Smokey Bear. The slogan eventually became "Only You Can Prevent Wildfires."
