



Dec. 9: Celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary

Because the traditional celebration of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception falls on a Sunday this year, SS. Isidore and Maria Parish will celebrate this important holy day with

daily Mass at 12:15 p.m. on Mon., Dec. 9. While this is not a Holy Day of "obligation" it is nonetheless an important feast day within our liturgical year. Mass at 12:15 p.m. provides an opportunity for more people to attend. This Mass will occur at St. Paul Church instead of the usual 7:30 a.m. daily Mass.

We often come to life expecting the puzzle pieces to fit together nicely. We want and expect harmony, order, fairness, and the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good

health, and happiness. We can more readily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life but have real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. We desire positive results if we are willing to put in a good measure of effort. When things go wrong, and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprisingly creative! He turns the tables on our understanding of life and what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but one who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us, pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in faith! There may be hardship and disappointment now, but there are more surprises to come.

Once we understand this truth, we will also know that we are on a most incredible and extraordinary universal journey to Christ and becoming one in Christ. We all carry within us the image of God, the idea of our suffering king. The One who lives in us also lives in all of our brothers and sisters. Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king. Many things can bring hardship to life. If we keep our heads about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the most significant degree of justice possible. Even though there are many things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our most profound joy comes from our union with God and our brothers and sisters. One day, the fullness of that joy will be ours to have when we are all eternally one with Christ our King forever.

In 1621, the Plymouth colonists and the Wampanoag Native Americans shared an autumn harvest feast acknowledged today as one of the first Thanksgiving celebrations in the colonies. For more than two centuries, days of Thanksgiving were celebrated by individual colonies and states. It wasn't until 1863, during the Civil War, that President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national Thanksgiving Day to be held each November.
