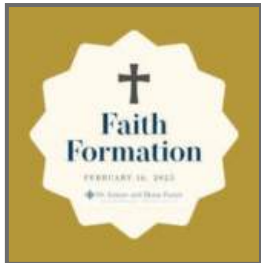

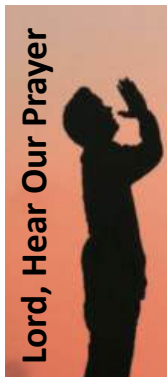

What has been the most difficult challenge you have faced in your life?

Many difficult human experiences can "turn up the heat" in our lives, causing us to

question the "why" of things or even fall into despair. Some people somewhat passively accept what life brings, even death, and chalk difficult experiences up to happening "because they do." They seemingly endure and move on. Taking life at face value, things have no ultimate meaning. It's easier to ignore that inner prompting calling us to understand why. It's there whether we admit it. To question or not to question? That is the question! People sometimes give up the God search because it causes too many questions. Once we open the door to the possibility of God's existence, then all of the awkward, challenging, and tragic pieces of life have to find their place. It gets messy.

But searching is so important in life. We can easily dry up and become arid, abandoning any hope for purpose and meaning because it's sometimes too difficult and non-rational. In searching for answers to the how and why of life, human beings also search for God. When one finally stumbles upon God's real, living, tangible presence, that discovery allows life's ironies and tensions to be held alongside God's all-encompassing, totally unconditional, unmerited love! Then, when life's heat gets turned up, difficulties and challenges abound, dryness and heart-ache become the norm, and the soul remains in joyful repose. There is no fear.

The beatitudes celebrate life's ironies and tensions, holding them together in the Kingdom of God. Poverty, hunger, weeping, being insulted and hated are not things we would typically associate with being God's friends. But they are! In fact, those who experience these uncomfortable realities of life are actually better off than those who do not. This is what makes Jesus' message so intriguing! Don't give up questioning. Questioning the apparent inequities and polarities of human experience will undoubtedly challenge one's faith. But it's the only way to deepen it.

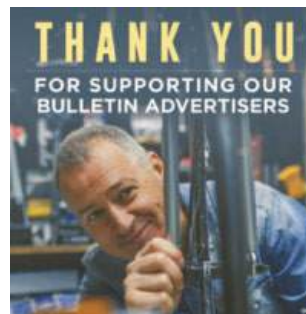

This Day in History — Feb. 21, 1957

Smoky (c. 1943 – February 21, 1957), a Yorkshire Terrier, was a famous war dog who served in World War II. She weighed only 4 pounds and stood 7 inches (180 mm) tall.

In February 1944, Smoky was found by an American soldier in an abandoned foxhole in the New Guinea jungle. Another GI then sold Smoky to Corporal William A. Wynne for two Australian pounds. Smoky was credited with twelve combat missions and awarded eight battle stars. She survived 150 air raids on New Guinea. Smoky even parachuted from a tree from 30 feet (9.1 m) in the air using a parachute made just for her. Wynne credited Smoky with saving his life by warning him of incoming shells on an LST (transport ship), calling her an "angel from a foxhole."

In her downtime, Smoky learned numerous tricks, which she performed to entertain troops with Special Services and in hospitals from Australia to Korea. According to Wynne, Smoky taught him as much as he taught her. On February 21, 1957, "Corporal" Smoky died unexpectedly at the approximate age of 14. Wynne and his family buried Smoky in a World War II .30 caliber ammo box in the Rocky River Reservation in Lakewood, Ohio.

Harry and I salute Smoky and all our friends, the heroic war dogs and therapy dogs. We also protect our Dad, alerting him to all sorts of critters. We are always "on patrol."

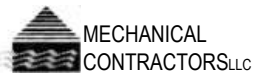
