

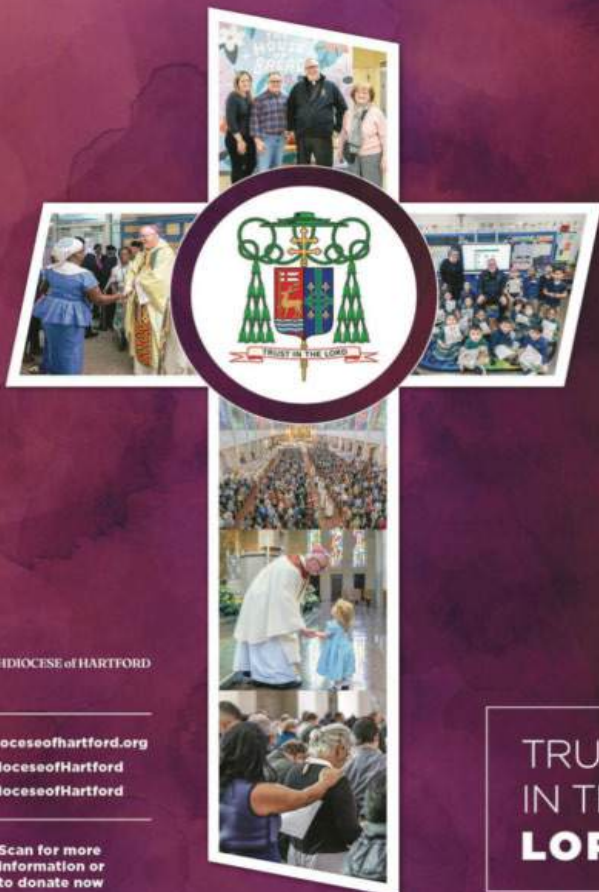

Inspiration for the Week

"From the fullness of the heart, the mouth speaks." What we say reveals so much about who we are. It discloses what is really going on within us: our integrity, priorities, depth of conscience, level of compassion, and understanding of mercy. People whose speech is judgmental or overly critical usually reveal an interior life that is angry, unsettled, defensive, and shallow. Our speech communicates our sense of right and wrong, the strength of our relationship with God, and how we feel about our fellow human beings. We are also quick to point out the faults of others, concentrating on their shortcomings and wrongdoings before our own. Only God fully understands what is going on inside the human heart. Only God can see the depth of a human soul. Perhaps it would do us well to consider what may be happening inside our brothers and sisters and temper our critical speech of what we see occurring outside. Looking within will also help us identify our sins and weaknesses so that we can be better positioned to offer wisdom and compassionate guidance that can genuinely help our friends.

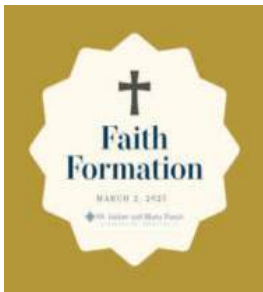

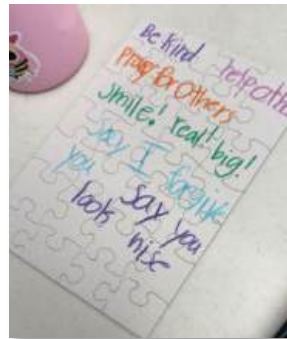

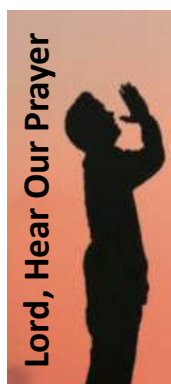

Lenten Sacrament of Reconciliation Schedule

For Lent, SS. Isidore and Maria Parish will conduct the Sacrament of Reconciliation each **Monday** from **12 noon to 1 p.m.** at St. Paul Church. This is in addition to reconciliation on Saturdays at 2:30 p.m. The dates are as follows:

Mon., Mar. 10 **Mon., Mar. 24** **Mon., Apr. 7**
Mon., Mar. 17 **Mon., Mar. 31** **Mon., Apr. 14**

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.



What we say and how we say it reveals the true intentions of our hearts. The content and manner of our speech is a window into the recesses of our souls. Our consciences,

attitudes, sentiments, weaknesses, and motives are displayed. As much as we think we can hide the truth of our lives from others, we cannot. Who we are is expressed on our lips and written on our faces. Jesus says precisely this: "For every tree is known by its own fruit." What does the fruit of our lives say about us?

Because we like to play the game of hide and seek with ourselves, pretending that we are hiding deflects the attention others may give to us by becoming more critical of others. After all, the more time one can spend analyzing others'

behavior, the less time one must look at oneself. Often, the behaviors we abhor most in others are those we are guilty of ourselves. We just don't know it yet. The more we put ourselves in the role of a judge, the more satisfaction and control we seem to achieve. Yet, what about ourselves? In focusing our attention on the beams in others' eyes, the aridity and barrenness of our lives goes unchecked. St. Ambrose reminds us that "no one heals himself by wounding another." Bringing our brothers and sisters down by being overly critical serves no positive purpose.

But the one who knows how easy it is to fall into sin and weakness and how quickly errors in judgment can be made knows the depth of true compassion, mercy, and kindness. Recognizing our poor choices, misguided opinions, negative emotions, and ability to do horrendous things, we can be more sympathetic and understand where others may be. We are designed to be mentors and guides to one another. In walking the journey together, we can help each other become the best they can be. Humility is the order of the day and the primary virtue that prevents us from being hypocrites.

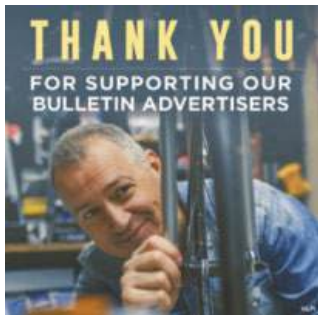

This Day in History — March 4, 2025 — Mardi Gras



Mardi Gras, or Fat Tuesday, refers to events of the Carnivale celebration, beginning on or after the Christian feasts of the Epiphany and culminating on the day before Ash Wednesday. Mardi Gras is French for “Fat Tuesday,” reflecting the practice of a final evening of eating rich, fatty foods before the ritual Lenten sacrifices and fasting of the Lenten season. While not observed nationally throughout the United States, some traditionally ethnic French cities and regions have notable celebrations.

Our Dad is of Polish heritage but we won't see paczki or any sugary treats in our house today! Harry, what are we giving up for Lent? How about our treats? Oh no Oliver! Both of us can give our Dad some extra “penances”. He always says something about “pain” and our barking!

Mardi Gras arrived in North America as a French Catholic tradition with the Le Moyne brothers. In 1723, the capital of Louisiana moved to New Orleans, and the first Mardi Gras parade is said to have taken place there in 1837. The tradition in New Orleans expanded to the point that it became synonymous with the city in popular perception and embraced by residents of New Orleans beyond those of French or Catholic heritage. Mardi Gras celebrations are part of the basis of the slogan *les bons temps rouler* (“Let the good times roll”).
