All: We will enter into and love the mission of the Gospel and embrace the ministerial needs of our parish. We will actively strive to build a community of love where all can find a home. We will labor for justice and live lives of peace. We will toil to put our personal needs and desires aside and work for the good of our neighbor. And, at each day's end, we will place our lives in your care, O Loving God, ready to awake and begin again.

Celebrant: O God of all times and ages; we gather this night before You and prepare our minds and hearts to celebrate the wonderful gift of Your Son in the Eucharist. We now take a moment to remember and ask forgiveness for the times we have not lived up to the ministry of the Church and when we have not embraced the Gospel call to service.
