March 29, 2026 | Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

LET US BEGIN by Rev. Anthony Smith, Pastor

Today, we begin the most important week in our Church's liturgical calendar. Holy Week is truly a roller coaster ride of emotions. We begin with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where people welcome Jesus with a carpet of palm branches. A procession of people shouting 'Hosanna' as Christ comes in riding on a donkey.

When Thursday arrives, we begin the Triduum. Jesus desires to share the Passover meal with his closest disciples. There are prayers and joyful songs, but for Jesus, there is a touch of sadness and anxiety. During the meal, Jesus continues to teach by example. He shows his disciples the call to serve in their ministry by washing their feet. Most importantly, Jesus gives his disciples and His Church the most precious gift of his body and blood in the appearance of bread and wine. He then commands them, 'Do this in memory of me'. Over two thousand years later, we continue to do what he did. And finally, it would be at this last supper that Jesus acknowledges his betrayer in Judas. Following the Last Supper, Jesus must now face the reality of what is to come. In the Garden, he is filled with distress, and he brings this fear to his Father in prayer. He accepts his Father's Will, and shortly before dawn, he is betrayed by a kiss from one whom he loved as a disciple.

Good Friday brings us to the depths of sadness and sorrow as we follow Christ on the road to Golgotha. We commemorate the point of his death on the cross with the celebration of 'Friday – the Passion of the Lord' at 3:00. (Also, Stations of the Cross at St. Augustine at 6:30). The tabernacle is empty, the church sanctuary is void of adornments, and there is a feeling of absence as we leave the church in silence.

When Saturday arrives, we are still in the time of absence. When evening approaches, there is a glimmer of hope as we begin the Easter Vigil. We begin in darkness, a darkness that came upon the world when Jesus dies on the cross. A flicker of light begins to enter in. (continued on page 4)

A fire provides a source of light, and from that fire, a candle is lit. The candlelight spreads throughout the community and slowly enters the church as we begin the solemn vigil. The Easter Vigil Mass begins in silence and darkness but ends in triumphal sounds and bright light. When Easter Sunday arrives, the world is changed forever. Hope is restored, joy becomes our destiny, and we praise God who, through His Son Jesus, destroys death and sin forever. It is the height of joy, and we are called to celebrate.

I invite you to make this week truly a solemn and memorable time in your faith journey. Come experience the joy of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Join in the Last Supper on Thursday and walk alongside him with his Mother as he is led to his death on Good Friday. Then be with us to celebrate the great joy of Easter at the Vigil or Easter Sunday. It is a week like no other. It is a time that will deepen your relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a week that reminds us of the depth of God's love and of our call to live in that love.

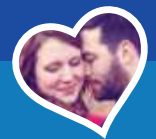
