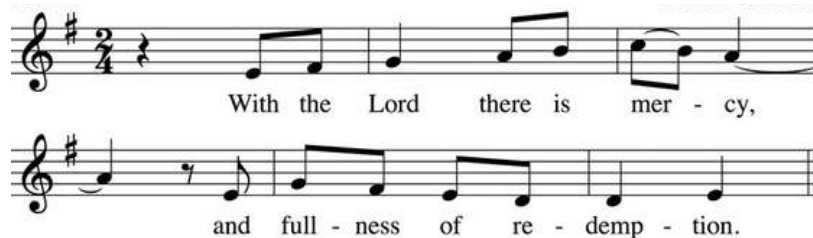

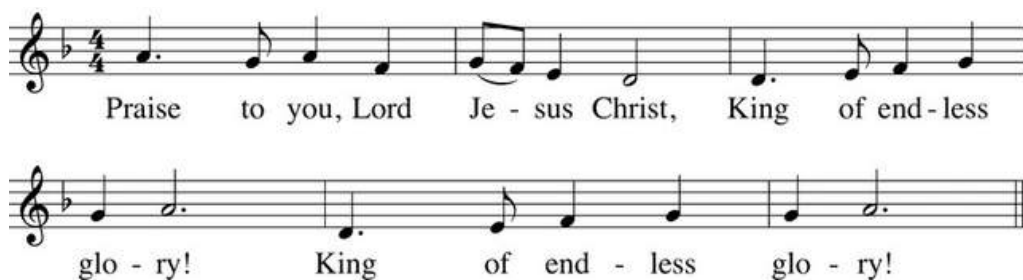

John 11:1-45

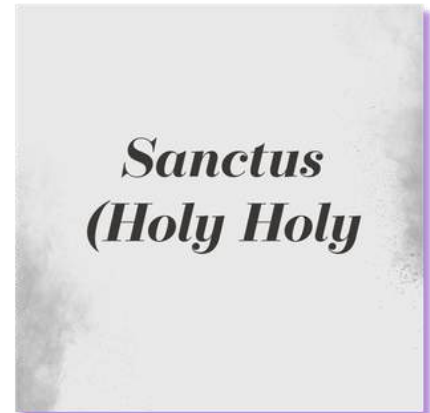

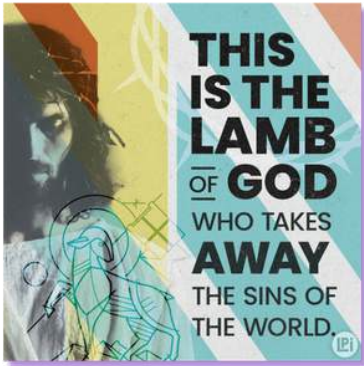

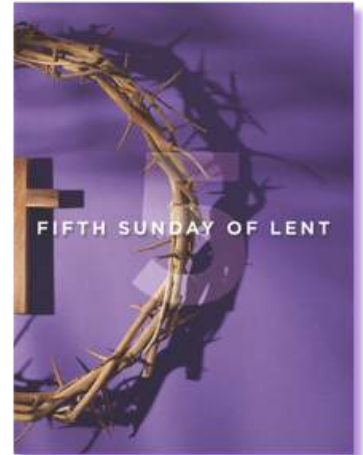

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LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

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2026 Lent and Holy Week Schedule

With Lent underway, we welcome you to attend Monday Lenten Reconciliation with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, along with Stations of the Cross each Friday throughout this holy season. Get the full schedule of these events, along with the Holy Week Schedule, below, or by scanning the QR code.

Stations of the Cross: Come with us each **Friday in Lent at 6:30 p.m.** at St. Paul Church* as we meditate on Jesus's journey to Calvary.

**On April 3 (Good Friday), Stations of the Cross will take place at St. Augustine Church*

Reconciliation: In addition to weekly reconciliation each Saturday at 2:30 p.m. at St. Paul Church, our **Lenten reconciliations** will take place each Monday during Lent at 6 p.m. The location will rotate between St. Paul Church and St. Augustine Church as follows:

- **Mar. 23:** St. Augustine Church
- **Mar. 30:** St. Paul Church

Daily Mass during Lent: Daily Mass will be celebrated each Thursday at 7:30 a.m. at St. Augustine Church. This is in addition to the regular daily Mass schedule.
